# County Says Rid Fly, Odor Problem Or Else

DELAND — A County Health Dept. official said Thursday Rogers Egg Farm on Marsh Road would be told to eliminate a fly and odor problem “or else.”

“It will be done today,” Sanitation Supervisor Gerald Page said at the close of a County Commission session in which homeowners in the area northeast of DeLand asked again that something be done about the nuisance.

Under the “or else” provisions of the law, Commission Atty. Charles Luther said state or county health authorities can:

—Order the nuisance corrected within

a specified time. If it isn't done, the health agency can have the job done and bill the owner for the expense.

—Swear Out a nuisance warrant against the owner.

Page appeared in response to a Commission letter of July 19 in which the Health Dept. was asked to investigate fly and odor complaints.

Page said he'd found the egg farm operator cooperative. Diminishing complaints indicated the situation was improving. Page said rainy weather and the fact that some homeowners had cows or horses aggravated the problem.

Mrs. Gordon Skillman, spokesman for an eight member delegation, said she “disputed” some of Page's statements, especially the one about few complaints and the contributing factor of the homeowners' animals.

Commissioner Robert Strickland appeared to voice Commission sentiments when he commented: “You have been getting complaints about this for five years. It looks as if the Health Dept. could have done something about it by now.”
